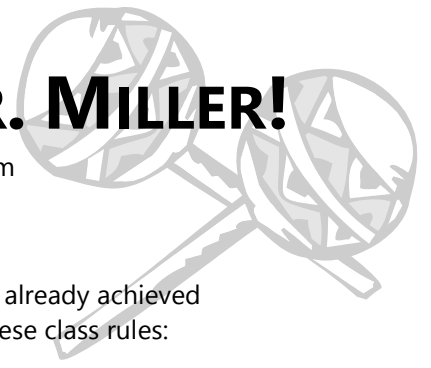


¡BIENVENIDOS A LA CLASE DE SR. MILLER!

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BEING AWESOME:

Congratulations on your choice to learn Spanish! By making this choice, you have already achieved awesomeness! If you want your grade to be as awesome as you are, just follow these class rules:



1. **FOCUS! Listen to all Spanish spoken in class and try to understand it.**
2. **ONE person speaks, and the others listen.**
3. **Support your classmates!**
4. **Nothing on desks unless told otherwise.**
5. **Respond aloud to ALL class questions.**
6. **If something is not clear, ask for help NOW.**

How well you learn Spanish will depend on how well you follow those rules. You may also receive a participation grade based on how well you follow those rules.

TESTING & GRADES:

You will have frequent mini quizzes to test your listening skills. **Listen closely to all Spanish spoken, because you may be quizzed on it at any moment.** Larger tests will be announced in advance so you can prepare. You may be asked to place any/all electronic devices in a designated location during testing. At the end of the marking period, if your grade is within 0.5 points of the next letter grade, and if you turned in all your work and participated in class, I will at my discretion round you up to the next letter grade. You can check your grade online at any time. Grades are typically updated within two days of the test.

SCHOOLWORK:

Failure to complete or to turn in schoolwork will result in a zero for that assignment. Likewise, work missed due to absences turns into a zero once the allotted make-up time has passed. Missed assignments may be completed and turned in for half credit up to one week late. Late work may not be submitted after the end of the marking period. **Cheating, or using a translator or an AI to do your work for you is NOT awesome and will result in a zero.** The same applies to turning in work that someone else corrected for you.

EXTRA CREDIT:

Extra credit is available through optional activities as noted by the teacher. If you do well at each opportunity for extra credit, it is possible to earn a 5% bonus each marking period.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

You should have a 3-ring binder with a section dedicated to Spanish to organize your class materials.

GETTING HELP:

If you need extra help learning Spanish, try one of these three options:

1. Come and see me during activity period (make sure to get a pass ahead of time!)
2. Review the learning materials on Canvas or at mr-miller.com.
3. Go to the guidance office and sign up for peer tutoring during activity period.

The best way to learn is to immediately ask me for help in class any time you are confused!
